

Rules and Regulations:

All exhibitors in these classes should comply with these rules and regulations, any exhibitor that violates them will forfeit any prize or prizes to which they may be entitled.

All produce exhibited must be grown by the Exhibitor. All other entries must be the exhibitor's own work, class 2, 122 & 130 should be the groups own individual & joint work.

All exhibits should be displayed by 9am on Saturday and remain for general display until 5pm on Sunday. Any exhibitor collecting items prior to this time will forfeit any prize money due.

We take your privacy seriously, by providing your personal information by email, post or phone you agree to the Horticulture Manager holding and using the data to administer your entry or contact you for this and future Egham Royal shows, unless you inform us not to contact you.

Photos may be taken of exhibits and the prize giving and used for the purpose of promoting the Egham Royal Show on our website and social media pages, if you don't wish to be photographed please make the Show team aware.

Exhibits are left at Exhibitor's own risk. The Association, its Members, Officers and Servants are not accountable and take no responsibility for anything that may happen (from whatever cause or circumstance) to Exhibitors, their servants or ANY Exhibit or Property brought to the show ground or otherwise for anything else in connection with or arising out of, or attributable to the Association's Show.

The Horticulture Manager reserves the right to cancel any class with three or less exhibitors, and to amalgamate classes. In the event of a class having to be cancelled, the entry fee will be returned.

An exhibitor withdrawing an exhibit after entry will not be entitled to a refund.

Staging Requirements:

EXHIBITORS MUST provide their own vases, plates, cloths, boards etc. as required for display of exhibits.

Please bring your exhibits to the Horticulture tent for staging on **Friday between 2pm and 6:30pm** Alternatively you may bring exhibits on **Saturday morning between 7am and 9am**

Please park to unload in the **Exhibitor drop off point** outside the perimeter fence and use the entry gate at the rear of the Horticulture marquee, vehicles will need to be moved to the main car park after unloading. No vehicles will be allowed on the showground on Saturday or Sunday.

Exhibitor cards should be collected on arrival to stage your exhibits, please check and display with each exhibit. DO NOT label Exhibits with your name (such labels will be removed). Exhibits can be labelled with your exhibitor number which can be obtained from the Horticulture Manager.

For Horticulture exhibits Please label with the variety of the plant or vegetable as visitors like to know. Should you have a problem with any staging requests above please let the Horticulture Manager know when registering your entries so that alternative arrangements can be made.

Show Close

All exhibits should remain on display from 9am on Saturday through to 5pm on Sunday.

Exhibits may only be collected after the Prize giving on Sunday from 5pm, any Exhibit not collected by 6pm without notification of prior alternative arrangements will be disposed of.

Judging

JUDGING FOR ALL HORTICULTURE MARQUEE COMPETITIONS WILL COMMENCE AT 9:15AM ON SATURDAY

(Judges will follow relevant guidance and rules from the latest addition of RHS handbook, NVS, NDS, NCS, RNRS, BFS, National Honey Show, NAFAS guidelines and the WI "On with the show" latest handbook)

Stewards may move exhibits as necessary.

Judges decision is final, any Protests or objections should be made to the Horticulture Manager in writing by 4pm on the Saturday, all queries will be looked into, and responded to.

Points for the Challenge Trophies will count as follows: 1st 5 points 2nd 3 points 3rd 1 point

Maximum Trade space allowed 20ft x 8ft, all goods displayed must be within the allocated area and NOT encroach onto the public walkways.

Please indicate how many tables you require, up to a maximum of 8 tables.

The BUREE PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP will be awarded for the best trade display.

Gold, Silver or Bronze Medal cards may be awarded at the discretion of the Judges.

<u>Special Note:</u> Traders are responsible for their own sales. For safety reasons Trade vehicles will be allowed to unload on the Friday and on Saturday & Sunday morning at the **Exhibitor drop off point** outside the perimeter fence and use the entry gate at the rear of the Horticulture marquee, vehicles will need to be moved to the main car park after unloading. No vehicles will be allowed on the showground on Saturday or Sunday.

VEGETABLE SECTION

Please note: All exhibits in the fruit and vegetable section must be suitable for culinary use, may be washed, and will be judged according to the latest edition of the RHS Horticulture Show handbook in respect to their condition, size and uniformity. Each Kind of vegetable must all be the same cultivar/variety, please include with exhibit as visitors like to know. Classes 3 to 23 may be displayed on plates or bowls as desired, Exhibitor to provide.
